4-H AND COMMUNITY | A MONTANA SURVEY

The past few months have been trying indeed, especially for 4-H members, volunteers, and Extension educators who have worked hard to keep their county programs going. We know, from previous research, that 4-H builds character, provides youth with a sense of belonging, and teaches them important life skills. What we don't know, but are attempting to find out, is **how 4-H as an organization, affects communities.** Especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, the way that communities usually do things like operating county camps, fairs, and other community events has been turned upside down. We think that 4-H provides communities with continuity and contributes to community cohesion. To check this out, we distributed a Qualtrics survey to 4-H families and volunteers through 4-H online and to county Extension educators.

Summary of key findings include the following:

- Over **1,000 youth and adults** took the survey.
- Of those, approximately **30% were 4-H aged youth**.
- Approx. **68%** of respondents **participated in 4-H of some kind since March 28th** when the Governor's mandate was established.
- Approx. **70%** of participants worked on individual projects and/or **attended club or project meetings virtually or in person**.
- Responses from volunteers and extension staff were also compiled and while the majority of **Volunteers** (64%) focused on helping with 4-H project work, club meetings and social media interactions; **Extension Agents** time was split pretty evenly with providing information through various delivery methods to volunteers, youth and families.
