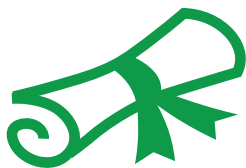

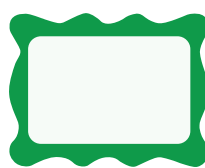

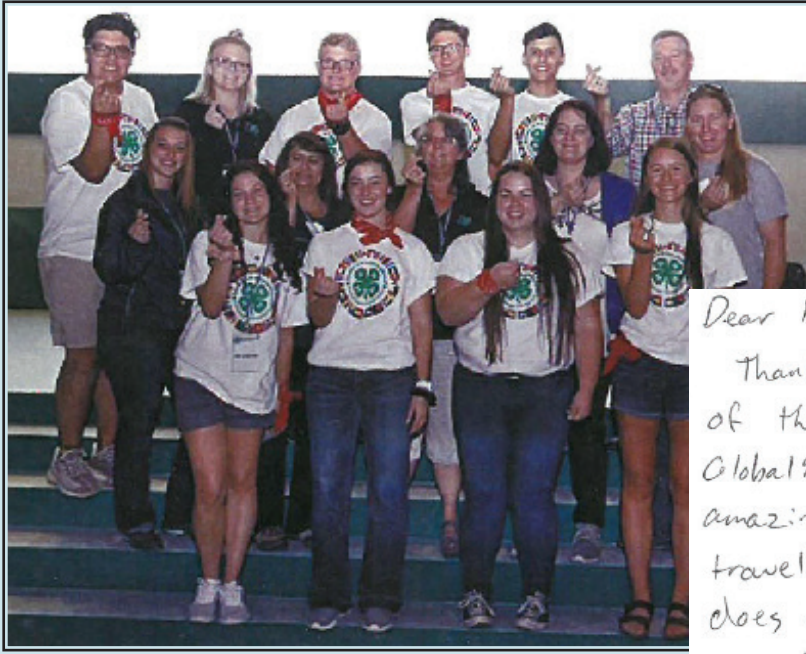

FRIEND OF MONTANA 4-H AWARD

The Foundation's "Friend of Montana 4-H Foundation" Award was given this year to Mr. Thomas Welch of Havre.

The Montana 4-H Foundation recently raffled off a collection of Don Greytak 4-H calendars to celebrate 28 consecutive years of a very successful 4-H calendar project. The complete 1992-2019 Montana Greytak 4-H calendar collection was donated to the Montana 4-H Foundation by Tom Welch who came up with the calendar idea and spearheaded the project's initial association with Montana 4-H when he was a member of the Montana Aggies.

Tom, an agricultural educator at Montana State University-Northern, believed Havre artist Don Greytak's pencil drawings of animals, children, machinery and rural agriculture scenes would be a natural for a Montana calendar. His initial thought was that every Montana County has 4-H members and these members and clubs could sell and benefit from calendar proceeds. The Montana Aggies and the Montana 4-H Foundation liked the idea and as they say, the rest is history as we are still selling these coveted calendars 28 years later.

Tom stated once that, "This is one of the most pleasing and rewarding projects I have ever been involved with", and he goes on to thank numerous others who helped with the project. The Montana 4-H Foundation would like to say thank you to Thomas Welch for his fortitude, generosity and commitment to 4-H, agriculture and the youth of Montana.

This year the Montana 4-H Foundation is proud to welcome five new inductees: Betty Ann Wolery, Earl and Janice Peace, Marsha Goetting, and Barb Larsen.

Betty Ann Wolery of Joplin has served as a volunteer in 4-H for over 30 years! For many years Betty served as a volunteer leader in the Chirping Meadowlarks 4-H Club in Hill County – where she was described as “a teacher and an overachiever – she wanted every kid to do their best!” Betty Ann didn’t stop volunteering after her three daughters left the program either, recognizing the importance of having caring adults in youths’ lives, she continued volunteering where needed in both Teton and Liberty Counties, and still helps where needed today. Dedication and devotion to 4-H are hallmark characteristics of Betty Ann. Most distinguished by her traits of willing service, impactful consistency, graciousness, and her lifelong desire to teach, Betty Ann continues to demonstrate these attributes year after year as a volunteer. Her leadership, service and impact on generations of 4-H youth and adults make her a valuable member of the 4-H family.

Both **Earl** and **Janice** grew up near the Polson, Montana area. 4-H was an important part of their lives with livestock and home economics. Both Earl and Janice were (IYFE) International Foreign Youth Exchange delegates. Janice was the first delegate of the first year (1948) and Earl a delegate a year later (1949). Janice served as a project leader in 4-H for several years, while both she and Earl served as supporters of 4-H both financially and as mentors. Earl’s career was as a dairy and swine specialist with MSU Extension but he also spent many years in prison ministry, where he offered a hand-up, not a hand-out, by providing housing, clothing, and guidance to released prisoners while they got back on their feet. Earl and Jan Peace have continued to support Montana 4-H through the

4-H Foundation. It is with heart-felt sympathy to the family we announce that Earl passed away November 18, 2019.

Marsha Goetting grew up in Kansas 4-H, where her parents were involved as leaders – something that left a large impact on both Martha and the community in which they resided. Marsha has supported 4-H in many aspects of her life as a 4-H Alumna, MSU Family Economics specialist and 4-H enthusiast. Marsha is a strong supporter of statewide 4-H through the MT 4-H Foundation, giving her talents as a wildflower photographer, her time to attend annual Foundation events, and her support of the Foundation financially as a “\$400 Club” member for many years. She has admired the People Partner Grant program in MT 4-H and is currently creating a leadership grant in her home state of Kansas in honor of her parents. Marsha has been a valuable partner to the State 4-H Foundation for many years and offers her wide array of talents in estate planning, defining types of gifts, including the MT Tax Credit, and providing donor education throughout the state. She is a true champion of Montana 4-H.

OUTSTANDING ALUMNI AWARD

The Outstanding 4-H Alumni Award is given to those who have made a significant impact on 4-H by promoting, supporting and enhancing the benefits of youth and adult involvement in a program or a specific 4-H project area.

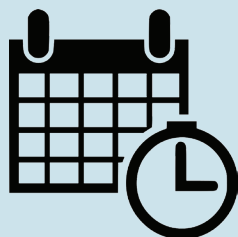

NATIONAL 4-H CONGRESS

Montana sent 16 youth delegates and 2 adult volunteer chaperones to represent Montana at the 99th Annual National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia. These delegates earned their eligibility for this outstanding award trip by either placing in a state contest or submitting a chosen state award application. All of these delegates exhibited exceptionalism in their respective areas.

Delegates and chaperones had an opportunity to interact with over 900 other 4-H'ers and adult chaperones from across the United States for a four-day event that focuses on

leadership, service and networking. While in Atlanta the group was able to engage with peers, tour and learn about history of the area and participate in a day of service. Delegates engaged with national speakers like Dan Clark, outstanding 4-H Alumni Kelly Loeffler, as well as Secretary of Agriculture Sunny Perdue.

The tradition to attend National 4-H Congress is strong and one we hope to continue to offer for generations to come. The experience can be best described by the youth themselves and the impact this experience has had is evident from their reflections.
